What is Fentanyl?

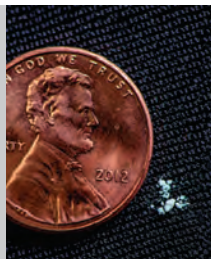
Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid that is 50 to 100 times stronger than heroin and morphine.

- It is nearly impossible to detect.
- A single use can be deadly.
- Fentanyl accounted for over 80% of drug overdose deaths in New Hampshire in 2023.

Fentanyl is in New Hampshire in many forms

- It is regularly mixed with substances like cocaine, heroin, and methamphetamine.
- It is now in counterfeit pills that look just like legitimate prescription medications.
- There have been more fentanyl overdoses than all other illicit drugs in New Hampshire combined.

A dose the size of a few grains of salt can be lethal. It is now seen in fake pills branded as Oxycodone® and Percocet®, among others.

Naloxone is a medication approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) designed to rapidly reverse opioid overdose.
